
## Sustainable Land Actions for Ohio



# Help Improve Ohio Environmental Health

You can make a major contribution by creating a certified, sustainable habitat in your yard and community so that our environment is healthy, beautiful and 'green' for future generations.

#### Governments

- Educate the general public about sustainable gardening practices
- Support 'Community Sustainable Habitats'
- Ban the sale of Ohio's worst Invasive Plants (www.oipc.info)
- Revise weed ordinances to allow gardens and yards to include well-maintained Ohio native plants
- Change laws to allow downspout diversion to rain barrels or water absorbtion areas (i.e. rain gardens, etc.)
- Toughen zoning legislation to protect natural areas, like wetlands
- Promote 'Green Space'
- Develop programs to curb 'Urban Sprawl'
- Require vehicle emission standards on gas powered lawn mowers, weed eaters, etc.

#### Homeowners

- Remove invasive species from your yard and community
- Incorporate a diversity of native plants into your yard and community
- Limit water consumption
- Reduce or eliminate chemical use on yard
- Reduce lawn area
- Compost
- Plant trees around your house
- Develop a rain garden
- Reduce use of gasoline-powered yard tools

#### **Schools**

- Create and maintain a 'Wild School Site' at every facility
- Incorporate ODNR's curriculum, already aligned to Ohio's education standards
- Use ODNR training and grant opportunities

#### **Farmers**

 Use grants to create sustainable land plots in areas that are not used for farming

### Plant Nurseries and Landscapers

- Incorporate native plants into your inventory
- Discontinue selling Ohio's worst Invasive Plants (www.oipc.info)
